Item 1: *Listening Comprehension Text*

Indicators of Achievement

The Candidate is expected to listen to the given passage and respond to five tasks demonstrating the ability to;

- i. Clearly explain a situation or event in the oral/audio-visual text using appropriate vocabulary forms.*
- ii. Correctly present a character and describe their actions, role, or behaviour in the text.*
- iii. Present relevant advice or lessons and/or show how the message applies to real life.*
- iv. Correctly present the main message or theme of the text.*
- v. Expresses reasonable opinions or predictions related to the events of the text.*

PART I

Indicators of Achievement

The Candidate is expected to make a presentation that lasts between 3-5 Minutes. In the presentation the candidate should

- i. provide sufficient well explained points about the topic.*
- ii. correctly use a wide range of B1 level grammatical structures.*
- iii. use varied and relevant vocabulary*
- iv. exhibit clear pronunciation and fluency*
- v. correctly employ the structural components of presentation (introduction, varied beginnings, coherent linkages and a conclusion)*

PART II

Indicators of Achievement

The Candidate is expected to take part in a Dialogue that lasts between 3-5 Minutes, with an aim of coming to an agreement about some action. In the Dialogue the candidate should

- i. lead the conversation partner to an agreement about a course of action.*
- ii. correctly pose and respond to questions.*
- iii. correctly and variedly make and respond to suggestions.*
- iv. actively maintain an interactive conversation.*

Sample Expected Response

In dialogue with one of the examiners, the candidate takes lead of the conversation by presenting the challenge, makes and responds to various suggestions, asks and responds to various questions, leading to an agreeable solution for both parties. The dialogue sounds like a conversation rather than an interview. Candidate is a conversation partner, not an interviewer or interview candidate.
